## ZOOM Exhibition

### EARTH&SOIL

A hands-on exhibition for children ages 6 to 12

**Extended until 1 September 2019!**

**New stations in the exhibition from March 2019:**

- **Ant Farm:** In the generously planned complex for ants, children can observe live ants working on the soil. In various interconnected terrariums, the children see how these industrious insects work on the forest soil, how they fetch food and building materials for the nest or remove the dung from it.
- **'Planted', a card game:** In this game, specially developed for the exhibition, the children learn about agricultural food production by engaging with topics such as soil composition, the consumption of nutrients by crops, water availability, fertiliser use, weather conditions, pests etc.

Earth is the planet on which we all live. Earth also refers to the soil that we all walk on. Although soil forms only a very thin layer on the land surface of our planet, it is enormously important for humankind and, indeed, for life in general. It provides the ground for our food and plays a key role in all natural cycles. Without fertile soil, we would be unable to feed ourselves: we live on what grows in and under the soil.

Soil provides a habitat for humans, animals, plants and microorganisms. It also serves as a storage compartment, as a filter and a buffer. Importantly, it also functions as a water reservoir and yields renewable raw materials.

Our hands-on exhibition allows children to explore how soil develops and its complex composition. They discover that its bustling life goes deep below the surface. Every square metre of soil contains more organisms than all the people on Earth combined! This goes far beyond the moles, beetles and worms we all know, to include mites, woodlice and the full range of microorganisms, such as fungi, algae and bacteria. All these life-forms play a crucial role in recycling the wastes that accumulate in nature, providing the nutrients for plant growth. The kids can dress up as curious soil organisms and dig and crawl through the cavities and pores in the different soil layers. They learn to identify the superheroes of humus formation — earthworms — and can zoom in on even the tiniest soil inhabitants in the microscopy laboratory. They observe real ants working above and below the ground in interconnected terrariums. They dig into the city's soil and unearth remains from the past along with many other exciting finds.

The kids can make seed balls from a mixture of soil and seeds, and then watch the plants as they germinate and sprout. Our natural cycle game shows them how plants extract and absorb water and nutrients from the soil

as well as carbon dioxide from the air. Finally, the multimedia agriculture game allows youngsters to test their talents as farmers. They learn that the supply of valuable fertile soil on our planet is limited and threatened by improper farming practices along with ever-expanding human settlements and traffic surfaces.

The soil's biological diversity and its complex ecological balance represent a rich heritage that must be preserved. Our new hands-on exhibition sheds light on these intricate interrelationships and underlines how important it is to protect the soil under our feet.

### Be a Plaster Master!

Workshops for children ages 3 to 12

Giant sculptures made of plaster are sprouting in all directions in the ZOOM studio. With clay, wire and lots of plaster bandages we bring old objects back to life. A rickety bike turns into a flying plaster-mobile. A little carousel horse is transformed into a plasto-saurus. And fingers in a plaster cast suddenly become a bunch of carrots! The kids experiment with plaster as a material, and create fanciful figures, landscapes or sculptures. They experience with their own hands how something liquid becomes solid, something soft turns hard - and sometimes everything gets colourful!

**A colourful and varied play and adventure space for toddlers and pre-school children**

With ZOOM Ocean, ZOOM Children's Museum offers a unique area for play and experience, specially tailored for the motor, cognitive, and social abilities of children aged from 8 months to 6 years.

Since 2002 more than 500,000 sailors big and small have taken to sea in our steamer Famosa and experienced exciting adventures. They have explored caves, gone on fishing expeditions, and sent messages to the lighthouse.

Famosa drops anchor in Central America. In the green, mysterious habitat of jaguars, armadillos, chameleons, tapirs and other exotic animals, the children can use costumes to transform themselves into colourful rainforest creatures.

There are special baby appointments for babies and toddlers where children aged 8 months to 3 years can explore the ZOOM Ocean in a sheltered atmosphere.

For children ages six and older, there are separate times for older brothers and sisters.
